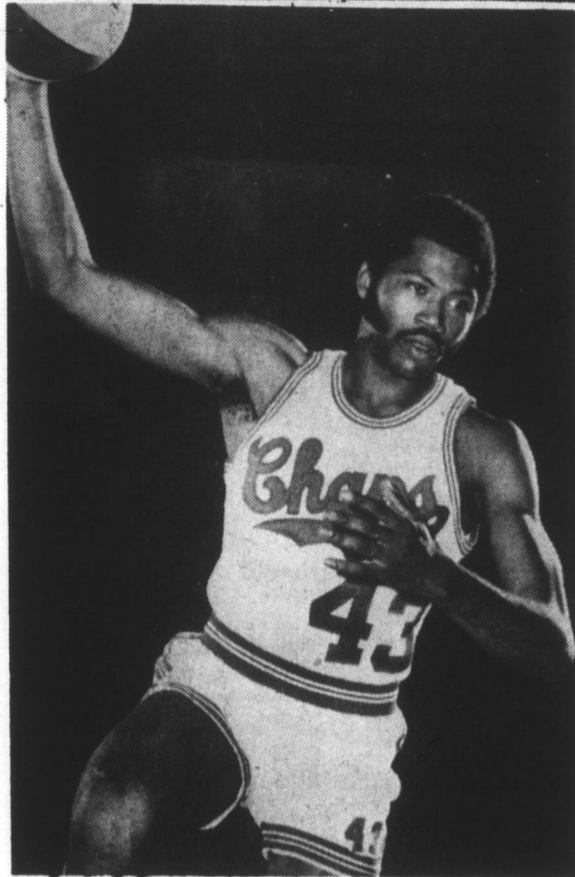

HAMPTON PIRATES STEAL GAME FROM N. C. CENTRAL UNIV. EAGLES

Cory Anderson bank a pair of free throws with just six seconds left to hand the Eagles of North Carolina Central a 79-75 loss and a dim chance of good standing in conference play, Saturday night in Hampton.

The victory gave Hampton a 4-9 conference record and over-all 9-14 log. Central is now 7-3 in league action and 7-9 for the season.

With 1:57 left in the game, Central was down 73-60 to the Virginia squad but sported to within four on Lou Ellis' two foul shots with just 33 seconds left at 77-73.

Victor Crawford and Prentice Hill each had 19 points to spark Hampton. Anderson added 15 for the winners while Curtis Ransom had 14 and

Freddie Richardson collected 13.

For Central, Redan Leggett pumped in 19 points. Others in double figures for Central were Ronald Phillips with 12 points and Allen Reddish with 11.

Under the backboards, Central held a 49-44 edge. Leggett had 10 retrieves for the Eagles while Ransom and Crawford both had 10 each for Hampton.

CHARLOTTE — Shaw University moved into a quick two point lead here recently but that was the first and last time they were able to lead a relentless Johnson C. Smith five and as a result the Bears ended up on the tail end of a 112-96 score.

The southern division conference contest produced a duel within a duel as Raleigh High ex stars Bobby Moore and James "Twiggy" Saunders made it an interesting and delightful spectacle for the fans.

It was obvious from the point that Saunders entered the game for the Bulls that he and Moore had a friendly war going. Saunders was no match for the 4th year Bear veteran as Moore dropped in shot after shot and pulled the

ball away from Saunders time and time again. Moore wound up on top with 22 points and 18 rebounds. The best Saunders could do was 8 in each category.

Brilliant work on the inside by seniors, Antonio Vaz and Arthur Davis for the Golden Bulls and the sensational outside shooting of senior, William Coles and sophomore, Steve Joyner gave Smith the startling upset over the Bears. Moved to a double post to help out center Bob Butts, Vaz responded with 12 rebounds and 25 points while Davis was hustling in 29 to lead the Bulls to only their fourth victory in eleven engagements with CIAA opponents.

Smith Coach, Joe Alston said it was different for him

to explain the fired up Bull five. They lost by 11 points in Raleigh 10 days ago.

They started out with one of Coach Ira Mitchell's tricks, a full court press. That along with inaccuracy of the Bears was the difference. Smith had a 23-12 edge after five minutes. The advantage went to 58-37 by halftime.

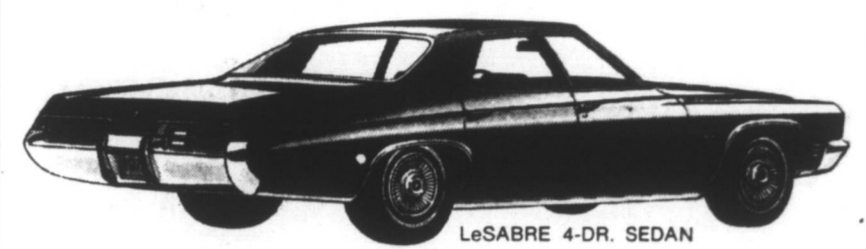
