Also in the same room, the family has a free standing storage unit, consisting of closet space, shelves and a desk. The unit helps to screen a play area from the sleeping area and offers needed extra storage, Mrs. Blake observes.

Billing Errors Occur, Here're Steps to Take

RALEIGH -- Although it would be nice if it never happened, billing errors do occur. What then?

First, notify the store or credit card issuer immediately, advises Mrs. Justine Rozier, extension home management specialist, North Carolina State University. Tell them of the mistake. Ask for the name of the person you are dealing with and make a note of the name as well as the date. You may need this information later.

If your contact is in writing, it is best to send a separate letter rather than including your complaint with the bill. Remember to include your credit card number. Keep a copy of the letter. Send copies of the bill

or other documents, but keep the originals yourself.

Read all bills carefully when you receive them, and never pay for any part of a bill you do not owe. Do not pay for merchandise you have not received.

If you have difficulty in getting correction of billing errors, send a factual letter to the credit manager or president of the company. Explain your problem in detail in a businesslike manner, leaving out any unkind remarks. Include copies of bills, sales slips and similar information.

If you are still unable to settle the complaint, send the details and evidence of your efforts to the local Credit Bureau. Send a carbon

copy of this letter to the merchant who has not corrected the billing error.

With accurate records and a businesslike manner, a person is

generally able to get errors corrected. Legitimate businesses do not make mistakes on purpose and are anxious to correct errors and keep consumers' good will.

NEW FABRIC

Although not on the market yet, there is a fabric that responds to temperature changes. As the temperature rises, the fabric becomes thin-

ner and cooler. As the temperature falls, the fabric increases in thickness and warmth retention. So before long, a single garment may play year-round duty, notes Harriet Tutterow, extension clothing specialist, North Carolina State University.
