departments in the humanities division of the school (the departments of art, English, dramatic arts, modern foreign languages, music and philosophy), it has in the first year reached freshmen with many other majors.

In addition to sessions for the English students, the project staff compiled bibliographies for the departments of art, music, Shakespeare and Black Studies Sources. A list of subject headings in drama was also prepared.

Plans for the next four years include the development of an "armchair tour" of the library for students in orientation classes as well as the well-used slide-tape introduction which will be quite updated. Project assistance is planned with freshman English classes so that all students may have aid with their topics.

Faculty profiles are being developed, listing subjects taught by each faculty member, professional and vocational interests and other pertinent information so that they can be kept abreast with new resources in their particular areas!

Further plans for expansion include the services to faculty using graduate assistants from the university's school of library science.

### Hints for HOMEMAKERS

Tested Tips To Help You

Any washable item except for glass and mineral fibers and some polyesters and acrylics can be dyed with all purpose fabric dye. If in doubt about fiber content, dye a small swatch first to test for color result.



You can change or renew colors on large items like bedspreads and slipcovers, by using your washing machine and all purpose Rit dye. For bright and lasting colors on smaller items, use a simmering dye solution. Rinse thoroughly and dry away from direct sunlight.

You can use dye for coloring many vinyl plastics, such as shower and window curtains. Costume accessories such as simulated pearls, plastic jewelry and buttons can also be color coordinated in a dye solution.

Fiberglass draperies are not dyeable. However, if resin coated, the coating is often dyeable. Cut a small swatch from a place where it won't show and test for color results. Tint draperies in lukewarm water using light or medium dye colors.

**GOBBLETS AND HOBBLERS**

When a turkey walks with a stiff, painful gait, his owner is more than likely to consider this condition strictly for the birds. And there are other probable symptoms of biotin (vitamin H) deficiency in turkeys.

Besides leg-weakness and foot pad lesions, signs of such disorders are uneven growth, poor feathering and dry skin.

Much can be done to reduce the seriousness of these conditions by supplementing turkey feed with biotin, however. If any of these symptoms is present, a continuous offering of feed fortified with biotin is probably in order. Such a feed will prevent and possibly cure a biotin deficiency in animals.
