**CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE SUPPORTS BOND ISSUE IN PRINCIPLE**

The Citizens Advisory Committee for Community Improvement met July 11 and unanimously voted to support the Program for Progress bond referendum scheduled for a vote September 8.

Dr. Annette L. Phinazee, chairman of the Committee and Dean of the School of Library Science at North Carolina Central University, stated that the Program for Progress includes most of the Committees' recommendations regarding use of revenue sharing funds. Dr. Phinazee said, "Revenue sharing funds should be expended for people, and the Program for Progress addresses itself to the needs of Durham's citizens."

The bond issue includes \$15 million in general bonds for paving of residential streets, recreation improvements, a fire training facility, and street thoroughfares, and \$2 million in water and sewer bonds.

In a letter to Mayor James R. Hawkins endorsing the program in principle, the Committee reminded the City Council of the need for continuing citizen input as details of the Program for Progress are developed.

In reply to the Committee's endorsement of the Program for Progress Mayor Hawkins stated that he was looking forward to the Citizen's Advisory Committee working with the Council in implementing the Program of Progress.

**MORE BEEF**
