New Craze: Creative License Plates

What do Carroll O'Connor of Beverly Hills, California (star of TV's "All in the Family"), Rita Young of Honolulu, Hawaii and Bill McKenney of Columbia, South Carolina all have in common? License plates.

Each of these people has joined the growing number of motorists in certain states who have created their own personalized license plates. Yes, drivers in some states are disregarding the hurtling tons of steel around them and are instead busily reading and chucking at each other's passing license plates.

Rita Young's Hawaiian plates appropriately read ALOHA, which is among the single most popular message for "vanity plates" in that Pacific state. So popular, in fact, that it has been issued ALOHA 1 through ALOHA 9.

Carroll O'Connor's tag, UGO FRD, advertises his own company - Ugo Productions, while Bill McKenney is among the group of creative businessmen whose license plate advertises the company he sells for, CASTROL, producer of high quality motor oils.

"For my second car, I toyed around with combining my messages, coming up with something like GREAT or TOPS on one and CASTROL on the other," says Bill. "But, let's face it. You simply can't drive two cars at the same time. So, I settled for my company's name on both."

In McKenney's state of South Carolina, there is an extra charge of \$15 for the special plates, but that entitles him to exclusive use of his message.

"I have first option on those plates," reports Bill, "and it's pretty inexpensive for a traveling billboard."

Has it paid off? "In one day alone, I counted fifteen people who either blew their horns, waved or pulled up to me at a red light to tell me they used or heard of Castrol's various oils and lubricants," explains the amiable six-footer. "It's been such a rewarding experience that I'm thinking of buying a small car."

Right, that's the newest motor oil which McKenney is selling in his company's line.

Some people in California advertise themselves in humorous ways. More than one driver has been tickled by Lawrence Welk's AI AN A2, the brick REDUCE on Jack La Laine's Caddy convertible and the TARZAN set of Hulbert Burroughs, son of the Apeman's creator, and its mate plate ME JANE.

But the problem in California was not the flaunting of business or celebrity status. Aware that in their state stunt is sometimes as pervasive as smog, officials of the Motor Vehicle Bureau imposed censorship from the start. In the

first three months of the program, nearly 11,000 of California's nine million car owners plunked down an extra \$25 - \$19.50 of which went into a special environmental protection fund - for ego plates. And about 1000 requests were refused because of either duplication or bad taste.

Most ego plates usually reflect good-natured fun. William Conrad of TV's "Cannon" displays DARNOC tags, which is easy to understand if you happen to read backwards. Ernest Borgnine's straight forward plates say BORG 9, while the zany Tim Conway's tag reads 13 WKS, which tells how long each of his three TV series has lasted.

As yet, the ultimate ego trip has not been translated onto any license plate, anywhere. That number would have to be... totally blank.

Drive At A Comfortable Speed

You are more likely to avoid mistakes that could lead to an accident if you are comfortable at the wheel.

Professional drivers at Plymouth's proving grounds, who drive long distances on endurance tests of new cars, offer these suggestions:

Before starting a long drive, be sure the driver's seat is adjusted so that you can reach all pedals and controls easily but not so far forward that you feel cramped.

Plan to wear comfortable, loose-fitting clothes for a long trip. The freer your body movements are, the more comfortable you'll be.

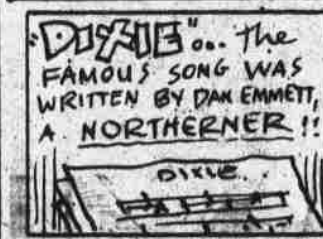
Chewing gum or hard, sour candy help keep the mouth fresh and reduce thirst.
