BUENOS AIRES, Argentina — John Davis Lodge, 66, who has resigned after four years as U.S. ambassador here, bid farewell to Argentina's provincial president, Rodolfo Lora, in a 15-minute visit Tuesday. Lodge is expected to leave the country in a few days.
