Women's Page Women Engineers Are Highly Sought

GREENSBORO, N.C., Women are increasingly finding an employment bonanza in the engineering and technical professions, the president of the Society of Women Engineers said in Greensboro Wednesday night.

"These seem to be areas where brains count more than anything else," said Mrs. Naomi McAfee, a high level manager for the Westinghouse Defense and Electronic Systems Center in Baltimore.

Mrs. McAfee was here for the chartering of a chapter of the Society of Women Engineers at A&T State University.

Referring to gains that women have made in the field of engineering in recent years, she pointed out that a national study revealed that the entry level salary for women in engineering the past two years has actually been higher than that for men.

"This is the only profession where this happens," said Mrs. McAfee, who supervises 150 employees for Westinghouse.
