# AGRICULTURE AGENT RETIRES

R. E. Jones, a pioneer with the North Carolina Agricultural Extension Service, retired Feb. 28 after nearly 44 years with the organization.

Jones is currently an assistant director of the Extension Service and associate dean of agriculture at A&T State University.

He was the first black to serve as an extension agent in Craven County, the first black to serve as an assistant director of the Extension Service, and the first black to serve on the national Extension Committee on Organization and Policy.

Extension Director George Hyatt, Jr., called Jones "one of the most respected extension workers in the county today."

"Mr. Jones is greatly responsible for helping us to develop one extension program involving North Carolina's two land-grant univer-
