O. J. Simpson, triple threat movie star, television personality and All-Pro running back, has signed an exclusive long term contract with the NBC Television Network, it was announced by Robert T. ward, President, NBC-TV

Under the agreement, Simpson will produce and star in NBC World Premiere movies, some of which will be done by his own production company.
O. J. Simpson Enterprises, appear in NBC-TV variety programs; and provide commen-tary for NBC Sports, includ-ing coverage of the 1980 Olympic games in Moscow. Simpson's participation in sports programming will not begin until July, 1978.
