Sara Hodgkins to Speak To Durham YWCA Annual Meeting At Downtowner

Ms. Sara W. Hodgkins, Secretary of the N. C. Department of Cultural Resources, will be the featured speaker at the 57th Annual Meeting of the YWCA of Durham. The public is invited to this dinner meeting which will be held Thursday, April 28 at the Downtowner Motel on West Chapel Hill St.

Mrs. Hodgkins' talk will include a slide presentation of the various opportunities afforded North Carolinians through the Department of Cultural Resources.

She is anxious to remove the "snob and elitist feelings" about art and artists and to spread the enjoyment of our state's resources to all the citizenry. The five-year-old Department of Cultural Resources in North Carolina is allotted an annual budget of \$11 million. This is just over one-half of one per cent of the total state budget to this multi-faceted department comprising the Archives and History, Arts and State Library.

North Carolina is somewhat unique as far as the arts go. It has the first state-supported

symphony orchestra, the first outdoor symphonic drama, the first state-supported zoo, the first state-supported School of the Arts, the first Governor's School for gifted high school students, the first permanent art gallery for the visually handicapped and the state provides purchase funds to the state Museum of Art.
