Secretary of State for Public Affairs and as a member of the U. S. delegation to the UN.

As a world traveled journalist, Rowan has traveled in virtually every country in the world with the exception of the Peoples Republic of China.

He was a 1954 recipient of the Sigma Delta Chi medallion for the best foreign correspondence of 1954 for his reporting from India. Rowan received the same prize in 1955 for his coverage of the historic Asian-African coverage in Bandung, Indonesia.

He is the only journalist ever to win Sigma Delta Chi medallions in three consecutive years; winning the 1953 prize for domestic reporting for his coverage of the school desegregation cases then pending before the U. S. Supreme Court.

Rowan, who grew up in poverty, has been and is one of American journalism's loudest and strongest voices in behalf of the nation's poor and minorities.

For his accomplishments in these many fields, Rowan has received some 29 honorary degrees from such institutions as his alma mater, Oberlin College, Notre Dame, Howard, the University of Massachu-

setts, Temple and Atlanta University.

It was as a reporter for the Minneapolis Tribune that he won numerous awards, including the Sigma Delta Chi medallions. Rowan left the Tribune in early 1961 when President Kennedy asked him to join his Administration.

After four and one half years in government, Rowan returned to journalism in 1965 as a columnist for the Chicago Daily News and Field Newspaper Syndicate. His syndicate column is carried by newspapers that go into almost half the homes in the country.

Rowan is a permanent panelist on "Agronsky & Co.", a popular public affairs show which is viewed on television stations in 40 of the nation's largest cities.

His political and social commentaries are aired regularly on the radio and television stations of the Post-Newsweek Broadcasting Company and Rowan is a frequent panelist on "Meet the Press."

Rowan is also a roving editor of the Reader's Digest, the world's most widely circulated magazine, for which he writes four to eight articles a year.

He and his wife live in Washington, D. C. and are the parents of three children.
