





NORFOLK, VA — A.M. Rivera, director of public relations at North Carolina Central University, was honored here last week by the Central intercollegiate Athletic Association at a star studded luncheon of former players, coaches, reporters and press agents.

The CIAA paid a special tribute to the 1946 North Carolina College basketball team which was victorious in the first CIAA tournament. Rivera was publicist for this team and the tournament.

When the CIAA tournament came to Durham in the early 1950s Rivera was chairman of the publicity and promotion committee. It was during this period under the direction of Rivera that the present format for the three day tournament, still in use today, was designed.




