## Low Income Parents Could Receive Help

GREENSBORO - A payment from the Federal Government of up to \$400 is available to certain working parents who earned less than \$8,000 in 1978, the Internal Revenue Service says.

It's called the Earned Income Credit and the basic requirement, in addition to the income limitation, is:

You must have paid more than one-half the cost of keeping a home for yourself and your child under 19, or one is a full-time student, or your disabled dependent child 19 years of age or older.

Earned income can be salaries, wages, tips and other forms of employee compensation as well as the net earnings from self-employment. This means that farmers could also qualify.

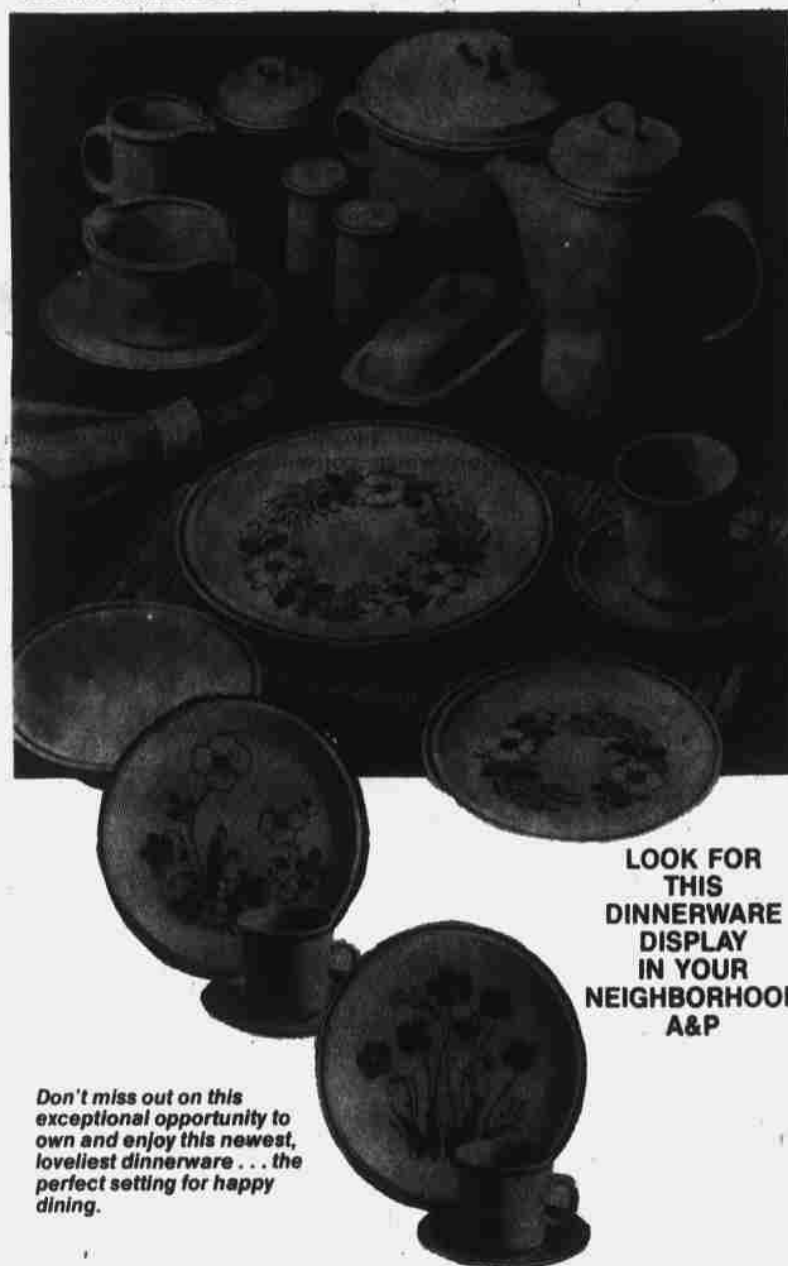
