

GREENSBORO, N.C. -Blacks can increasingly become owners of radio and television stations, if they are willing to pay their dues, the nation's top black broadcast manager said here Saturday.

Broadcast Enterprises Network Inc. firm of Philadelphia already owns six radio stations, made the remark during the second annual A&T State University mass media conference.
