The Men's Laymen League planned and executed the first annual Church Banquet for Mount Gilead Baptist Church, Saturday, April 21 at the Holiday Inn West.

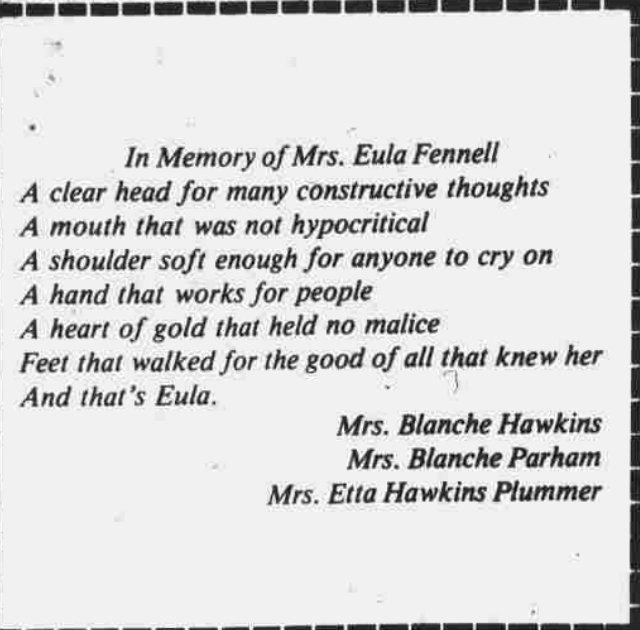
FIRST AID DEPARTMENT TO OBSERVE ANNIVERSARY

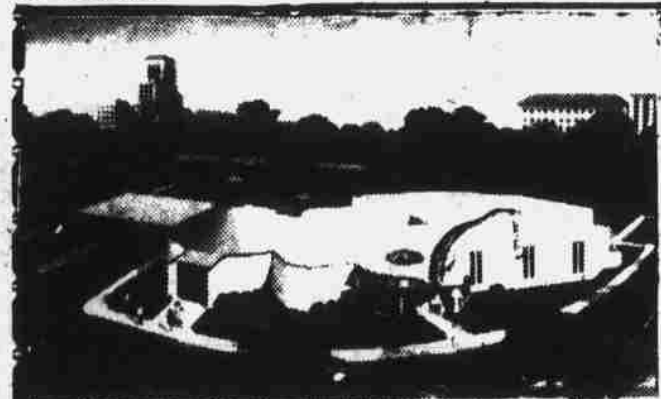
