National Religious Leader To Be Honored At A&T

GREENSBORO — Joseph C. McKinney, a nationally prominent religious leader from Washington, D.C. received A&T State University's alumni excellence award during the university's graduation exercise Sunday, May 7 in the Greensboro coliseum.

The award was presented by Dr. Lewis C. Dowdy, chancellor, after the commencement address by Max Robinson, anchorman for ABC Television.

McKinney, a native of Warsaw, (N.C.) is currently treasurer of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. The denomination encompasses 6,000 churches in the continental United States, 2,000 churches in Africa and 200 churches in South America.

Prior to assuming a second career as the church's national treasurer, McKinney served until retirement as a research scientist and engineer for the Armed Forces Security Agency and the Department of Defense.

He represented the nation on scientific missions throughout the U.S. and in Europe and Japan.

McKinney has been awarded honorary doctor's degrees from Morris Brown College, Edward Waters College, and Allen University. He has served as a member of the governing board of the National Council of Churches, a member of the Commission on Finance of the National Council of Churches, and president of the board of directors of the Meriwether Home for Children, which provides care for underprivileged children of Washington.

He is also treasurer of the Opportunities Industrialization Center (OIC), a national job training institute.

McKinney graduated from A&T in 1948, and has since studied at the University of Michigan, the University of California and the Pennsylvania State University.

Cited as one of the outstanding religious men in finance, McKinney is the author of two books about his denomination.
