The hearing will consist of an explanation of the proposed design. right-of-way requirements and procedures, relocation advisory assistance and State - Federal relationship. Other major routes will be separated without contact or relocated to stay in service. The approved location is alternate IB revised.

The NC 54 connector consists of adding two lanes to the existing two lanes with a 30 foot grassed median. The right-of-way will be that needed for this type section and will be open access. The connector
