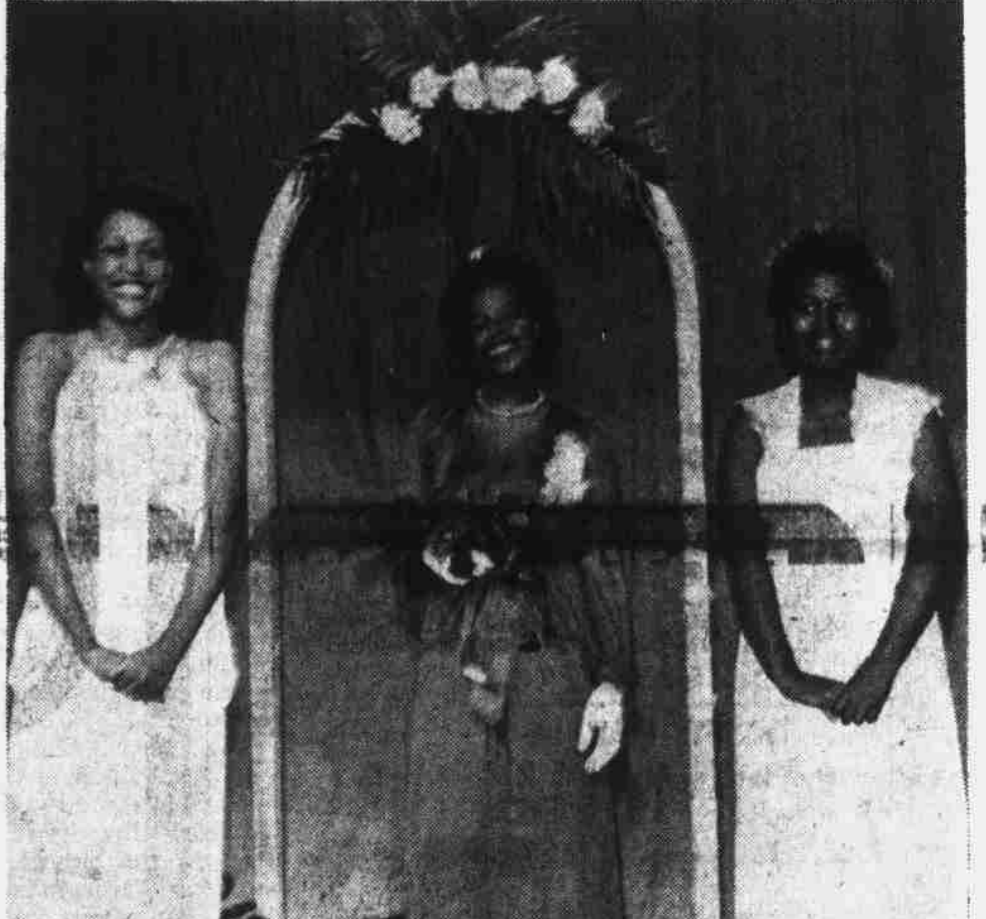


**MISS RAY AWARDED SCHOLARSHIP**

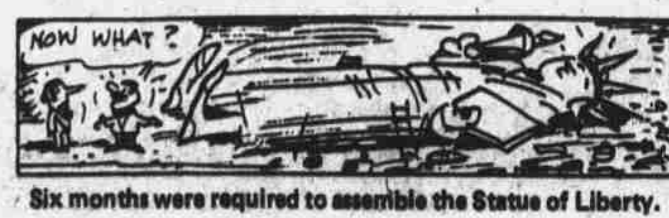


MISS TAUGADETTA AND RUNNERS-UP
