18TH ANNUAL SESSION OF PNBC TO BE HELD AUG. 6-12

The 18th Annual Session of the Progressive National Baptist Convencion (PNBC) will be held in New Orleans, from Monday, August 6 through Sunday, August 12. Convention Headquarters will be the Hyatt Regency Hotel, with sessions of the convention and its auxiliaries being held at the Municipal Auditorium and other hotels.

This will mark the first time that Dr. William Augustus Jones, Jr., militant new President of the denomination, presides at an Annual Session. Dr. Jones is Pastor of Bethany Baptist Church of Brooklyn, New York, and is the youngest man ever elected to head a major national Baptist convention.
