ECSU Receives NSF

Grant of \$235,211

ELIZABETH CITY -Elizabeth City State University has been named one of three North; dina univer jointly support the development of physical sciences programs and benefit from a National Science Foundation grant of \$235,211 awarded this week to East Carolina's Department of Chemistry and Physics.

The grant, funded through the National Science Foundation's Comprehensive Assistance to Undergradaute Science Education (CAUSE) program, will be administered to the consortium by Dr. J. William Byrd, chairman of the Department of Physics and Dr. Angelo A. Volpe, chairman of the Department of Chemistry at ECU. Dr. James H Townes, chairman of the Department of Physical Science, will administer the program at E.C.S.U.

The primary objectives of this program are development of a strong undergraduate program in applied physical sciences that will prepare students for jobs in a technolgybased society, development of strong universityindustry ties, and the identification and encouragement of minority (black, women, indian, etc.) and Caucasian students to pursue careers in these fields.

Interested students may enroll in an introductory three universities and complete an advanced program in applied science in ECU.

Features of the program will include specialization in applied chemistry and physics and industrial workshops to give students an opportunity to interact firsthand with industrial scientists in an industrial environment.

Because of industry's increasingly greater dependence on computers and related equipment, Drs. Byrd and Volpe said they are convince that a thorough grounding in the use of computers and familiarization with computing systems and neworks is "an essential feature" in the education of applied scientists for industry.

Byrd and Volpe said that establishing a computer network will make possible a variety of educational experiences for students such as anaylsis of experimental data, interfacing of experimental equipment, data storage on remote processors, and access to large computers.





The program is cosponsored by the Durham County Schools Community Education Program and Durham Technical Institute.

The evening diploma program will be located on the Southern High School

campus and will hold ses-sions Mondays through Thursdays between 6 p.m. and 10 ap.m. Academic courses will be offered at a cost of \$8 per semester. Students must buy their own textbooks.

Seven different courses in the areas of english, math, science, and socials studies are scheduled for the fall semester which will run from September 10 to December 14, 1979. Additional elective courses for diploma credit will be offered through Durham Technical Institute and through the county schools Community Education Evening Pro-

Up to five of the 141/3 units required for a diploma may be earned by work experience. Credit may also be given for prior units completed in an accredited high school program.

Upon successful completion of the program, including passage of the North Carolina Competency Tests, students will be encouraged to par-ticipate fully in Southern High School graduation ceremonies.

Sam Keel, Southern High School principal and principal of the new evening diploma program, ex-plained that the program is being begun in response to a community need and request for services.

The evening curriculum will be similar in setting and instructional program to the traditional school day but will be geared to students with adult responsibilities such as a full-time job or a family to support.




