With protection so easily available, it is shocking to learn from the American Academy of Pediatrics that one in three preschoolers in this country does not get immunized. That means that many children one to four years old are not protected against measles, rubella (German measles), whooping cough, diphtheria or tetanus. There are also vaccines for mumps, smallpox and typhoid. Your baby's doctor will advise you about the schedule for immunizations. If you don't have a family doctor, call your local public health department. It usually has supplies of vaccine and may give shots free of charge.
