DR. ADA FISHER TO SPEAK AT WHITE ROCK

Dr. Ada Markita Fisher, Chief Medical Officer, Plain View Health Center, Rose Hill, and the daughter of Mrs. Ada V. Fisher and the late former pastor, Dr. Miles Mark Fisher, will speak at White Rock Baptist Church, Sunday, October 28 at 6 p.m. for the Ushers Program celebrating the church's 113th Anniversary.

Dr. Fisher is a graduate of the University of North Carolina, Greensboro (B.A.); and the university of Wisconsin Medical School, Madison, Wisconsin (M.D.). She has done post doctoral training as a Family Medicine Resident with the Family Medicine Program, an affiliate of the University of Rochester and Highland Hospital, Rochester, N. Y. She is board certified in family medicine as a Diplomate of the American Academy of Family Practice and is licensed in New York State and North Carolina. In the area of teaching, she has served as consultant, counselor and teacher in health related courses at Madison High School, Rochester; General Medical Clerkships for third and fourth year medical students at the University of Rochester; and Clinical Instructor, Department of Family Medicine at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill.

Recipient of many honors and awards, she was chosen University of North Carolina "Outstanding Senior"; "The Outstanding Legislator", 1970 Summer Fellowship from the University of Wisconsin Family Medicine Program for research study; biographical inclusion in the National student Register; Duke Endowment Fellowship Grant for Clinical Externship in Primary Care at Lincoln Community Health Center; featured on the cover of *The New Physician* magazine with an article, "Diary of a Summer Extern"; Student National Medication Association Achievement Award for contributions to minority medical education and community service; Community Physician Award from the UNC-Chapel Hill Student National Medical Association; and nominated as an Outstanding Young Woman in American for 1979 and as a "Glamor" Outstanding Young Woman for 1980.

She has served as editor of *The Holler*, a weekly newspaper (Family Medicine Unit) at the University of Rochester; is a columnist for *The Carolina Times*; and has published several articles and written six books on minority medical education and related matters.

She served on the subcommittee NAACP and Duplin County Competency Testing; Greenveers Housing Authority; and various Greenveers planning committees.

Dr. Browne was a distinguished mathematician with numerous publications in professional and scholarly journals and had held four fellowships for post-doctoral study: a Ford Foundation fellowship at Cambridge University in England; two National Science Foundation fellowships at UCLA and California-Berkeley; and a Social Science Research Council Fellowship at Stanford University.

Her areas of mathematical research included the theory of groups, functional analysis, and topology. Her most recent research interests included the applications of newer mathematical theories and approaches to management, behavioral science and medicine.
