PIMIENTO CHEESE SPREAD

Combine ½ pound sharp Cheddar cheese, grated, one 4-ounce jar of pimientos, finely chopped, ¼ teaspoon sugar and enough mayonnaise to moisten. Store in covered container until ready to use.

BLUE CHEESE SPREAD

Combine ½ cup grated or crumbled blue cheese, 2 tablespoons sherry, ¼ cup mayonnaise, 1 jar (4 ounces) chopped pimiento. Add ¼ cup chopped parsley.

ONION SPREAD

Combine 8 ounces cream cheese, 1 can (16½ ounces) cream of onion soup, 1 jar (4-ounce) chopped pimiento and 2½ ounces dried beef, cut very fine.

BACON SPREAD

Combine 1 jar (8-ounce) chopped pimiento, ¼ cup cooked and crumbled bacon bits, 2 tablespoons minced onion and ¼ cup mayonnaise.

CREAM CHEESE-GARLIC SPREAD

Combine 1 jar (4-ounce) chopped pimiento, ¼ cup sour cream, 8-ounce package cream cheese, 1 teaspoon garlic salt and ¼ teaspoon paprika.

PIMIENTO-CHEESE SPREAD

Combine 2 cups shredded sharp Cheddar cheese, 1 jar (4-ounce) pimiento, tablespoon prepared mustard, ¼ cup sherry, ¼ cup sour cream, 2 drops hot pepper sauce and 2 dashes garlic salt in a blender. Freeze until well-blended. Chill for a few hours or overnight.

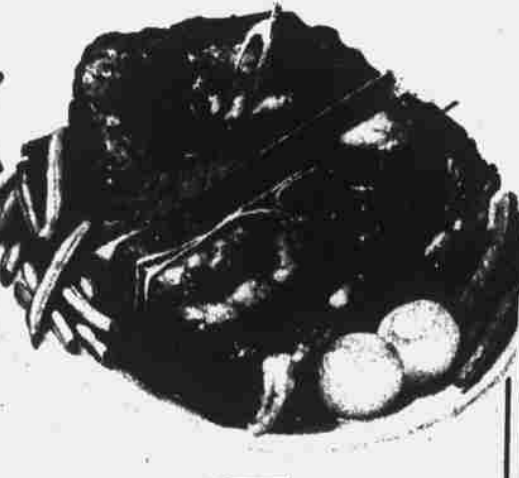
