The UNC Center for Public Television's second season brings the "good things in life" home to everyone this season. Ten new series premiering this winter and spring reflect the rich texture of American life and culture — its diversity, its resources and its promise — in programs starring Ossie Davis and Ruby Dee, John Houseman, Lillian Hellman and tennis coach Vic Braden. Twelve popular series return this season with new programs offering viewers an outstanding selection of drama, adventure, public affairs and performances in such favorites as *Masterpiece Theatre*, *The National Geographic Specials*, *Great Performances*, *Bill Moyers' Journal* and *Soundstage*.

MacNeil/Lehrer Report update viewers on current matters of importance; and public television's daytime schedule remains a treasury of informative entertainment for children and adults. And public television's specials again offer viewers the world in entertainment, the arts, current issues and dramatic human stories.

America is the produce of contributions by many cultures. *With Ossie & Ruby*, Sundays at 7 p.m. beginning February 15, celebrates our nation's multi-cultural heritage in a 13-part half-hour series starring author/director Ossie Davis and his wife Ruby Dee. *I Remember Harlem*, airing February 1-4 at 10 p.m. is a fond look in four episodes at the 300-year-old New York community which has been home to so many black Americans as well as Dutch, Hispanics, Irish, Jews and Finns. Beginning in April, *American Perspective: Another View* profiles the achievements of Americans of many cultural backgrounds in a 10-part series hosted by noted Chinese actor Keye Luke.

Teenagers from several ethnic backgrounds discover common problems, issues and goals in *The New Voice*, a 24-part series premiering Saturday, January 17 at 1:30 p.m. After a two-year hiatus, the critically acclaimed series about a group of first-year law students, *The Paper Chase*, returns to television screens on January 20 at 10 p.m.

Based on John Jay Osborne Jr.'s novel of the same title — from which the film was also taken — the 13-part series follows the adventures, crises and personal growth of several first-year law students under the guidance of the imperious Professor Kingsfield. Oscar-winning John Houseman portrays the stern but wise Kingsfield, and James T. Hart, whose study group is the focus for the series.

America's woman of letters, Lillian Hellman, speaks frankly about her art and her life in *Profile: Lillian Hellman*, a series of five half-hour interviews. Time Magazine art critic Robert Hughes illustrates the dynamic changes in twentieth century civilization as mirrored in its equally dynamic modern art in *The Shock of the New*, an eight-part series which starts on January 11. And on Monday nights Dr. Willard Gaylin leads viewers through the opportunities and the ethical questions raised by modern medical science in a six-part series, *Hard Choices*.

Tennis coach to the stars Vic Braden offers advice and frequently humorous insight to enthusiasts at all levels of skill in a new 13-part series *Vic Braden's Tennis For The Future* beginning in April.
