A Classic Ambrosia Served Warm - A Delightful Winter Dish

SUNNY AMBROSIA

- 1 1/2 cups Florida orange sections*
- 1 1/2 cups Florida grapefruit sections*
- 10 strawberries, cut in half
- 3 tablespoons shredded coconut
- 2 tablespoons honey

In crepe pan or skillet combine all ingredients and mix gently. Warm for 3 to 5 minutes. YIELD: 4 servings, 130 calories per serving.

*To section fruit, cut off peel round and round, spiral fashion. Go over fruit again, removing any remaining white membrane. Cut along side of each dividing membrane from outside to middle of core. Remove section by section over bowl to retain juice from fruit.
