## **NEW YORK SCENE**

NEW YORK - Donald E. Register, a graduate of the Howard University School of Music was the director of the 35-member ITT choral group from ITT World Head-quarters in NYC that appeared at the White House Christmas Pageant of Peace in Washington's President's Park. In New York, the interracial choir sang Christmas carols at ITT headquarters, at 320 Park Avenue, St. Patrick's Cathedral, Bellevue Hospital, the Pan American Building and the Lincoln Square Community Center.

The Jackie Robinson Foundation is presenting its first Jackie Robinson Memorial Celebration Gospel January 31, at the Cathedral of St. John The Divine, Amsterdam Ave. at 112th Street. The Rev. Jesse Jackson, Nikki Giovanni and Adeyemi Lythcott will serve as co-hosts. Among the artists will be The Jackie Robinson Foundaiton Memorial Mass Choir (created especially for this event with participation from choirs from the metropolitan area) conducted by Eugene Cooper.

Robert L. Gore, Jr. has been appointed deputy director and television manager of station WNYC-TV. Brooklyn resident, formerly acting radio manager at WGBH-TV in Boston, he will have the new task of defining new areas of service for public television. Mean-while, the Rev. Thomas Streitferdt, Jr. who conducts a Harlem-based religious group, True Witness Ministries, Inc., has asked the FCC for a hearing to see if the city shouldn't

lose its license to run the station. It's set for January 29 in Washington, D. C.
