Jesse Jackson, Nikki Giovanni and Adeyemi Lythcott will serve as co-hosts. Among the artists will be The Jackie Robinson Foundation Memorial Mass Choir (created especially for this event with participation from choirs from the metropolitan area) conducted by Eugene Cooper.

Robert L. Gore, Jr. has been appointed deputy director and television manager of station WNYC-TV.
