Thrifty Suppers Begin With Ripe Olives

There's a light touch of nutmeg in the sauce to accent t onions and sour cream and give an interesting subtle flave Serve "California Stroganoff" with bulgur pilaf and a color: vegetable-relish tray. Dessert can be as simple as an asso ment of cheese and fruit.

California Stroganoff 1/4 teaspoon pepper 1 cup pitted California 1/2 cup water flank steak, about

2 pounds 2 cups sliced onions 1/4 cup cooking oil

beef bouillon cubes crumbled 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg · 1 tablespoon cornstar

1-1/2 teaspoons salt 1 pint dairy sour crea Cut olives in slices or wedges. Cut meat diagonally in 1/8-inch thick strips. Brown meat and onions quickly in 1 oil. Add salt, pepper, 1/2 cup water, bouilion cubes and n meg. Cover and simmer 10 minutes. Add cornstarch mix with an additional 2 tablespoons water. Continue cooki stirring constantly, until thickened. Stir in ripe olives, Bla in sour cream. Heat through but do not allow to boil. Wakes 8 servings.


