Y.P.D.'ers of St. Joseph's Present Black Heritage Day

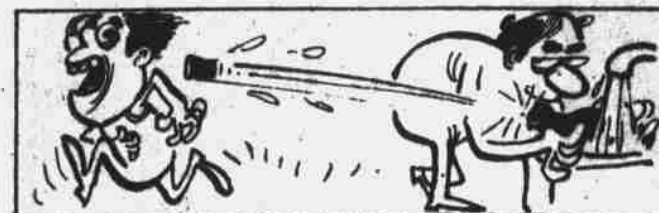
