Nureyev Dances Nijinsky During Festival Nights

International ballet star Rudolf Nureyev accepts a new challenge when he recreates three demanding roles of the legendary dance genius, Vaslav Nijinsky, in "Nureyev and The Joffrey Ballet/In Tribute to Nijinsky." Nureyev dances "Le Spectre de la Rose," "Petrouchka" and "L'Apres-midi d'un Faune"

in this special which airs Monday, March 9 at 8 p.m. On Center Channel 4. This performance is part of the Great Performances' "Dance In America" series.

Nureyev, whose impeccable style earned him the reputation of one of the twentieth century's greatest dancers, had been hesitant to perform the Nijinsky ballets because of the singular nature of dance created for one performer, a dancer he had never seen created the roles. Last August, however, Nureyev met the challenge of this triple-header program for television with characteristic diligence.

Because "Spectre de la Rose" continues to be a test for all dancers, Nureyev requested that it be the first dance taped, while he was fresh. Nureyev remarks on "Le Spectre de la Rose:" "I was resisting that ballet for a very long time. And whenever I saw it, the ballet didn't work and the costumes looked weird. But if you look at the photographs of Nijinsky in the role and in the positions and put them together then it works."

The Nijinsky "styles," created expressly for him by choreographer Mikhail Fokine, caused minor uproars wherever they were seen. "Fokine propelled him into international fame, onto a different level of dance," notes Nureyev. "He had excellent technique, and very exceptional movements, but was not really a classical dancer. Fokine made him

overcome the handicap. He never could be himself; he always had to be somebody else, something very exotic.

Nureyev, who shares with Nijinsky the ability to excite and compel an audience with his magnetic stage presence, has captivated audiences here since his defection in 1961.

As a testament to unfailing Nureyev's magnetism, the Nashville crew who videotaped the hour-long special sat stunned at the end of the first take of "L'Apres-midi d'un Faune.' According to Producer-Director Emile Ardolino, "there wasn't a peep, and then they burst into applause and 'Bravos'!" Remarked Nureyev, "I will continue to make ballet digestible to some who would not have the appetite

Free Black Genealogy Workshop For Beginners Set For March

Black genealogy — its methods, its deficiencies, its similarities and differences — will be explored in the first-ever workshop for black genealogists this month.

Sponsored by the N. C. Department of Cultural Resources as part of its continuing black history program, the N. C. Archives will present 'Black Genealogy Workshop for Beginners' on Saturday, March 21.

Applications are now being accepted for the free daylong workshop to be held at the Archives and History/State Library Building at 109 E. Jones St., Raleigh.

The workshop will consist of lectures on the use of records in the State Archives. Participants will learn the genealogical significance of court minutes, deeds, tax records, wills and estates, marriage records and census records.

"Black genealogy is different," said Ms. Minnie Bridges, workshop coordinator, "and a different approach is necessary. There are far fewer black records surviving, and many were lost in the numerous 19th century fires which leveled county courthouses."

The workshop staff will include members of the professional staff of the division of Archives and History. Admission is open to the general public, but Ms. Bridges advised early registration since the workshop is limited to 80 participants.

There is no registration fee. Registration begins at 8:30 a.m. with sessions continuing until 5 p.m.
