The Williams Family Circle held its regular monthly meeting at the home of Mrs. Thelma M. Hill of 411 Moline Street on March 5.

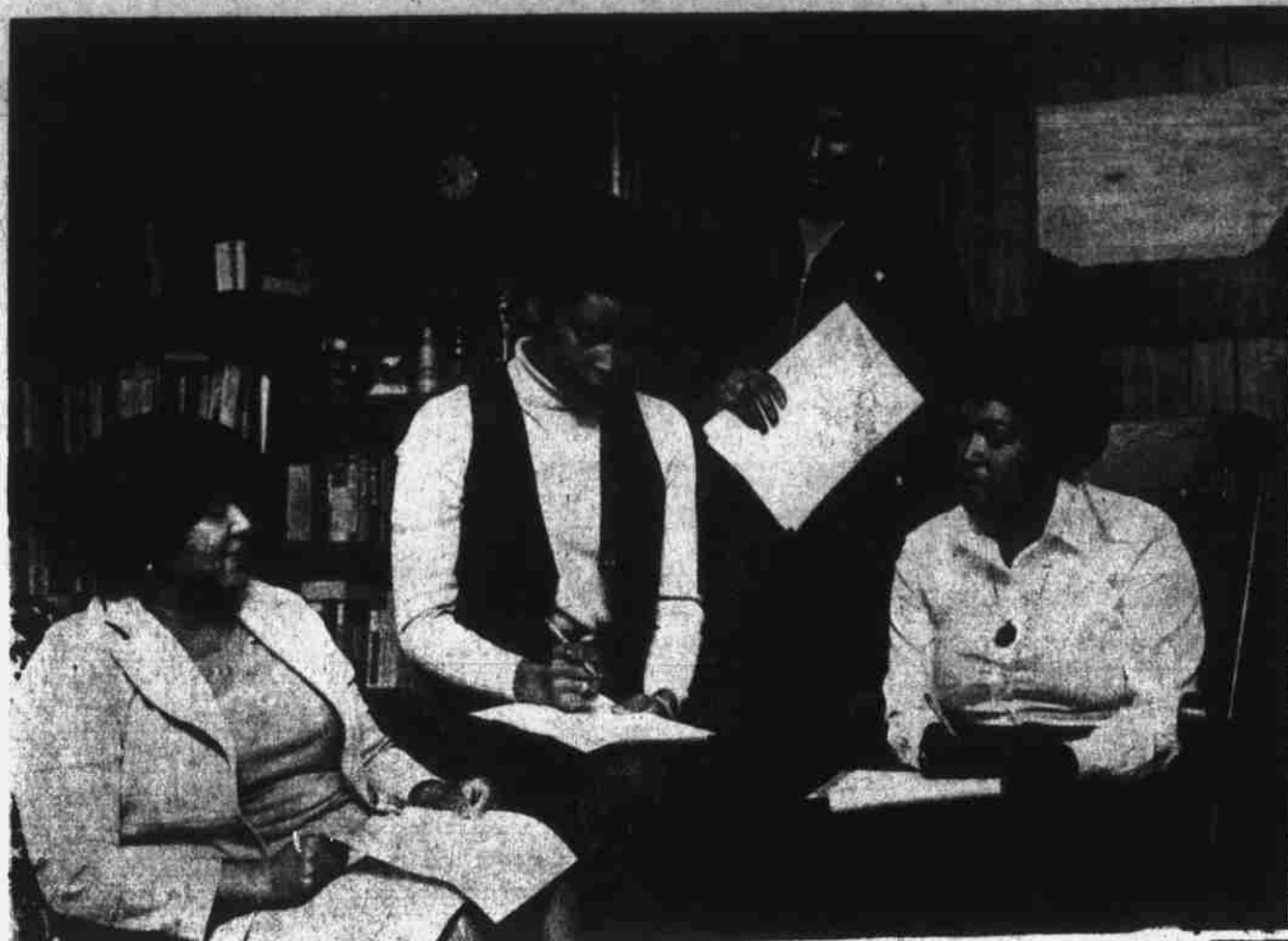
Devotion was led by Mrs. Katrina Boykins and Mrs. Hill.
