# Gizmo Appaluds The Wacky World of Inventions

They're wacky, they're wonderful and sometimes they even work. They're the oddball gadgets people have devised to accomplish almost any task from humanpowered flight to winding

spaghetti with an electric fork. These inventions and their dedicated inventors are the stars of Gizmo, an hilarious and loving tribute to creative genius and boundless imagination. Gizmo airs as part of the special programming on public television's Festival Nights, on Saturday, March 21 at 11 p.m. On Center Channel 4.

Assembled from 1930s and 40s vintage newsreel and documentary clips, Gizmo pays tribute to the scope of human contrivances from the ridiculous to the nearly sublime. A variety of daredevils challenge the forces of nature with devices which help them scale

#### skyscrapers, cross Times Square on a high wire suspended by their teeth, and, most of all, to fly merely by flapping all kinds of homemade wings. More earthbound challenges are met by a washing machine powered by a German shepherd, goggles with windshield wipers, a car equipped with an extra set of wheels so it can slip sideways into parrallel parking spaces and a boat that climbs trees.

Just as fascinating as their creations are the people who dreamed them up. One technician soberly explains how he learned to play "Yankee Doodle Dandy" by pressing air through his

palms and another demonstrates his skill at blowing up balloons through his left ear. A successfully airborne ski-glider is the concluding sequence of Gizmo, demonstrating that sometimes the most ambitious dreams really can get off the ground.

A winner at last year's Cannes Film Festival, Gizmo

was praised by New York Times film critic Janet Maslin as "a film guaranteed to make you smile," by col-umnist Rex Reed as "a full scale comedy riot," and by Mademoiselle magazine as "like watching Buster Keaton, Woody Allen and James Bond all rolled into one."

## Historic Trio To Perform On Center

#### BREAST-FEEDING IS BETTER FEEDING

Within two generations an interesting change in attitudes toward breast-feeding has occurred. Fifty years ago it was common to see a young mother stop and breast-feed her baby in public. No one thought anything of it. In those days it was the woman who smoked a cigarette in public who was considered odd. Today, a woman with a cigarette hanging from her lips passes almost unnoticed. It is the nursing mother who is looked at as an oddity.

Paradoxically our society accepts the health-destroying habit of cigarette smoking but gives little encouragement to the health-promoting practice of breast-feeding.

Certainly there are some instances where formula feeding is necessary when the mother may be unable to breast-feed her baby. Such situations are uncommon, though. The usual reason given for bottle-feeding is that it's more convenient for the mother. She is then left free to pursue the lifestyle of her choice without being present for her baby's nutrient requirements. It's convenient too in that fathers can assume a more active role in caring for the infant. But the mother's lifestyle and convenience are only two considerations. The baby has needs too. Recent studies show that touching and caring are as important to the baby as the nourishment received during breast-feeding. Severe emotional changes developed



in baby monkeys who were deprived of this closeness. Cuddling during nursing and the feel of the mother's steady heartbeat seems to be psychologically important to the baby.

The nutrient content of breast milk is also important. In the first place, the mother's milk contains some substances that help protect the baby from diseases. A recent report from England showed that breast-fed babies had fewer respiratory virus infections.

Mother's milk also contains better protein than formula milk. Her milk protein is almost two-thirds lactalbumin and the rest casein. Formula milk is usually mostly casein. the protein found in cow's milk. In addition, the blend of mother's milk is always at the correct level to meet the specific needs of the developing infant.

Breast-feeding may help control over-feeding as well. The haby nurses until he is satisfied, not until the bottle is empty. The phrase "nature is best" is applicable.
