Mrs. Park's children visited their aunt in Abetdeen for the weekend.

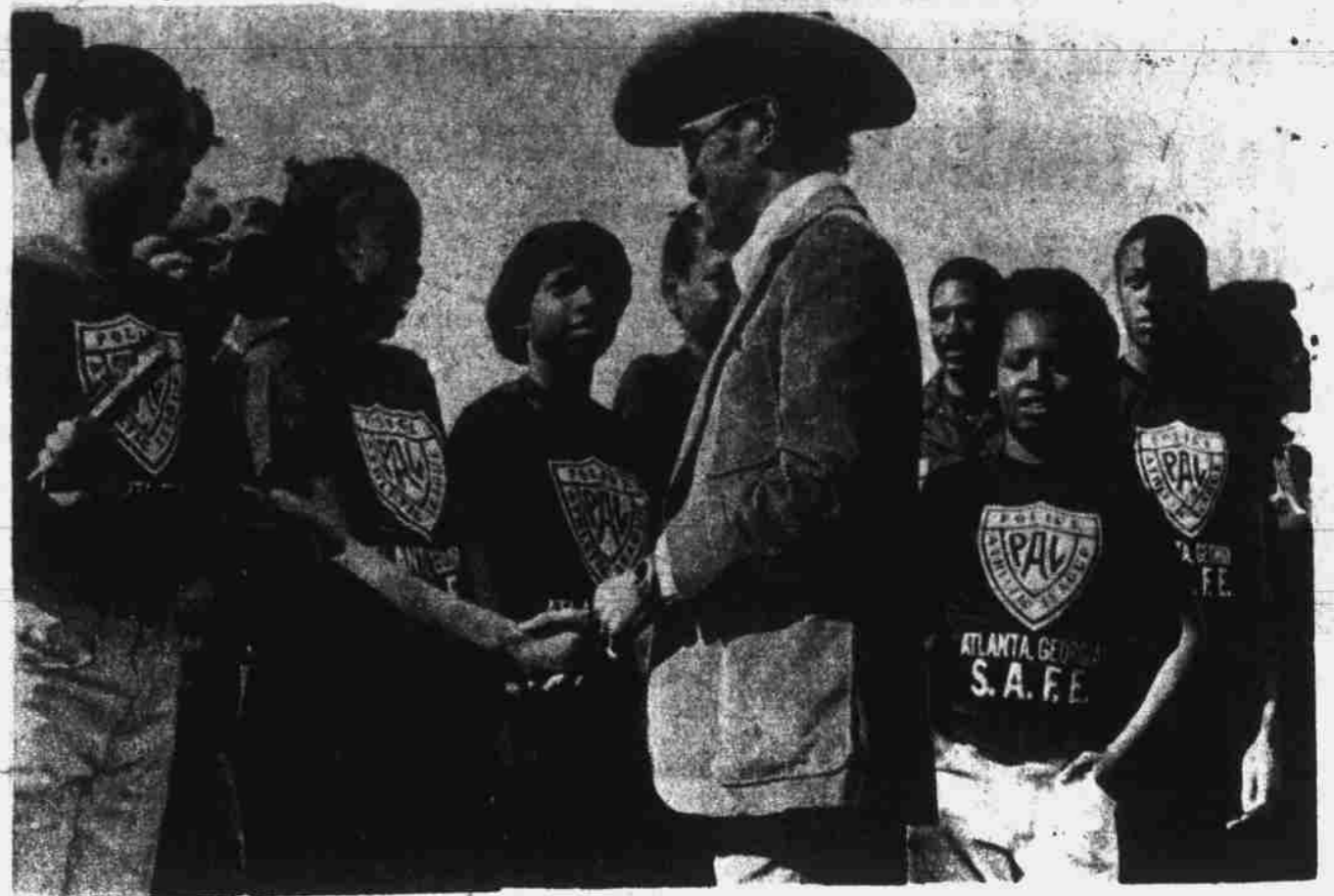

## Iota Regional Addresses Challenges Of Decade

"Women Facing Challenges In A New Decade" was the theme of the 44th Southern Regional Conference of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc., as it convened at the Ramada Inn March 13-15, with Rho Chapter as host.

The regional conference consisted of business sessions, exhibitions, awards, social and hospitality hours, educational luncheon, banquet and prayer breakfast.

Mrs. Verdell Johnston spoke at the topic "As I Go On My Way, Let Me Teach Others." Representatives of all chapters in the Southern Region were in attendance as well as several undergraduate chapters and national officers.

Dr. Fredda Witherspoon, national president, addressed the group on "An Agenda For The Eighties." She noted that our nation is still a long way from achieving justice for minorities, women and the economically disadvantaged. Far too many of our people are still feeling trapped in poverty — without the skills to overcome. Professional fulfillment, she said, will need to come increasingly from the family and community activities. She suggested tutoring workshops to teach children; taking a personal interest in children and letting them know you love them; using collective efforts to improve the quality of life for all Americans and especially black Americans.

Rho pledges, the Lomepas, constructed an exhibit of the history of Rho Chapter. Plaques and other materials which recounted public service projects, information about sorority members, outstanding achievements and awards that members have attained were also exhibited.

The Iota Phi Lambda Sorority was founded in 1929 by Mercedes Lola Parker and seven other women in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of encouraging women to seek business careers by providing scholarships. It has since grown to more than 100 chapters throughout the country with a membership of over 4,000.
