Women's Day At Mount Vernon

Women's Day will be observed at Mount Vernon Baptist Church, S. Roxboro St., Sunday, March 29 at 11 a.m. Dr. David Thomas Shannon, President, Virginia Union University, Richmond, Virginia will be the guest speaker.

Co-Chairmen for Women's Day are Mrs. Ruby Philyaw and Mrs. Geraldine Young. Dr. Percy L. High is pastor of Mount Vernon.

Church Leaders Meet in D.C.

Over a hundred black and white church leaders will gather in Washington, D. C., Tuesday, March 31 to kick off a long-term effort on behalf of poor children whose lives will be affected by the Reagan budget cuts.

The all-day meeting, which will take place at the Church of the Reformation, 212 E. Capitol St., is sponsored by the National Council of Churches' Division of Church and Society and Partners in Ecumenism (PIE). PIE is a council-related organization linking over 4,000 black clergy and lay people around social issues.

The keynote speaker, Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm (D., N.Y.), will focus on the impact that proposed budget cuts will have on poor black children, considered by PIE to be the nation's most vulnerable group.

Marian Wright Edelman of the Children's Defense Fund will also address the conference. The fund, an independent voluntary organization, has just published Edelman's book *Portrait of Inequality*, which deals with the problems of black and white children in U. S. society.

Other speakers include Senator Howard Metzenbaum (D., Ohio), who serves on the Senate Budget Committee; Bishop John Adams of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, NCC President M. William Howard; and Peggy Billings, a United Methodist executive.

"We are concentrating on the issue of budget cuts and children because from our perspective, the future of black and white children is now at stake," according to the Rev. Joan Campbell, head of the NCC Commission on Regional and Local Ecumenism, the council unit housing the PIE program.

"PIE was moved to action by the knowledge that even while the Atlanta tragedy drags on, the lives of other children across the nation are being destroyed by a combination of inadequate medical care, cutbacks in welfare support and inferior education."

Participants in the special day for church leaders will meet with their individual senators and representatives during the afternoon. Lobbying efforts will center on

food stamps, the Aid to Dependent Children program, Medicaid and funding for the Department of Education's programs, including the subsidized school lunch.

Recovering at the Church of the Reformation at the end of the day, conferees will map out actions that could be taken by local churches in their areas. The council is already cooperating with the Children's Defense Fund to get packets on the budget cuts into the hands of thousands of local church leaders. Research by CDF, the packets will be tailored to the situation in each state and mailed prior to the congressional spring recess. The council hopes local churches will use the recess, which begins April 16, to contact their representatives on children's justice issues.

Spaulding Introduces High
School Registration Bill

State Representative Kenneth B. Spaulding has introduced legislation in the North Carolina House of Representatives which would encourage a greater participation by 18 year olds and young people in the electoral process. Spaulding's bill would provide that public high school librarians may register voters at the various public high schools.

Spaulding said, "This legislation will help tremendously in the registration and representation of 18 year olds and young people on the voter rolls." "Not only can there be a greater participation by 18 year olds and young people in the electoral process, but also the judicial system will be constructively and positively affected. Jury pools are supposed to best

reflect the community at large and too often young people have been under-represented on such panels. Voter registration records are used by statute for selecting prospective jurors. Therefore, I feel that we should encourage not only increased voter participation by young people, but also increase their involvement in jury duty service."
