He has lectured at Howard University, Virginia Union University, Shaw University, abroad in North and South Zambia, Lesotho, Malawi, Johannesburg and Capetown, South Africa, Monrovia, Liberia; Hamilton, Bermuda; and Kingston, Jamaica. Dr. Cone's publications include: *The Identity Crisis in Black Theology, 1975; Why Do The Righteous Suffer? Preaching On Suffering and a God of Love*, edited by Young; *Black Religion: The Foundation of Black Theology; Perspectives of Black Theology: Teologia Nera*, edited by Rosino Givellini (Editrice Queriniana, Brescia via Piamerta 6 Italia, 1978); and *Stewardship from a Black Perspective*, Journal of Stewardship, Vol. 30, 1977.

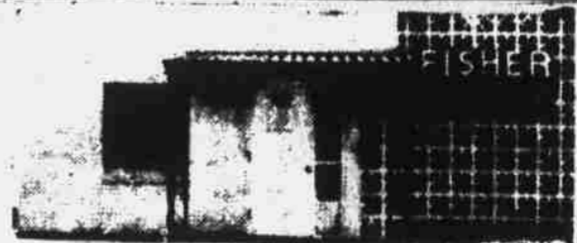
