The Association is composed of ushers of all denominations in the State of North Carolina and is divided into fourteen districts, from Charlotte to Kinston.

CBS To Televise Easter Service At Shiloh Baptist Church

WASHINGTON, DC — Shiloh Baptist Church, of Washington, D. C., has been selected by the Columbia Broadcasting System (CBS) for a live national telecast of the church's Easter Sunday Morning Service, on April 19.

In keeping with its tradition of televising live an Easter Sunday church service from somewhere in the United States, a CBS spokesman said that Shiloh Baptist Church has been recommended because of its long history of community involvement and unique urban ministry.

Shiloh is one of the oldest and largest black Baptist churches in the Nation's Capital. Founded in 1863, the church has a membership of more than 5,000. The Senior Minister is Reverend Henry C. Gregory, III.

110th Anniversary of Chapel Hill's First Baptist

CHAPEL HILL — First Baptist Church, N. Robertson at W. Rosemary, will celebrate its 110th Church Anniversary, Monday, April 27 through Sunday, May 3. Services will begin at 7:30 p.m. each evening.

There will be a memorial event each evening, featuring an accomplishment that each minister accomplished while serving the church since its beginning, 1865-1981. The ministers that served were the Reverends Cole, Mitchell, Hackney, Standford and Dr. J. R. Manley.

On Sunday, May 3 at 11 a.m., Dr. Standford of Newark, N. J., will deliver the Anniversary Sermon. As a climax to these celebrations, there is a Groundbreaking Ceremony at 1 p.m. at which time, Dr. J. R. Manley, pastor, Robert Drakeford, Mayor of Carrboro, and Joseph Nassif, Mayor of Chapel Hill, will bring greetings. Dinner will be served. The Church School will present *Twelve Gates to the City* at 7 p.m.

The history of the Church dates back to the close of the Civil War. Since this period, five ministers have served the Church. The Church has been a supportive agency to the Chapel Hill-Carrboro community, educationally and politically. The Church has given to the Chapel Hill-Carrboro School Board its first black member and to the Board of Aldermen its first member. The Church has had social programs, extending from Day Care to Senior Citizens.

Dr. J. R. Manley, pastor, presently serves as president of the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, the largest black organization in the state.
