TAKE BACK THE NIGHT MARCH — Workshop topics for the second annual Take Back The Night March have been finalized by the Orange County Rape Crisis Center. The activity, designed to call community attention to the problem of rape in Orange County, has been scheduled for Saturday, May 2.

Workshops, which will begin at 2 and end at 7 p.m., will be held at the Chapel of the Cross, 304 East Franklin St., in Chapel Hill. Discussions on acquaintance rape, sexual harassment, recovery from rape, assertiveness and women's self defense, and, men and rape, will be facilitated by volunteers with the Rape Crisis Center. Additional topics include incest, domestic violence, racism and rape, children and rape, recovery from rape, and legal options in both civil and criminal court.

The March itself will begin with a warm-up at 8:30 p.m. at the Bell Tower Parking Lot, scene of at least three assaults last Spring, and end with a rally at Carr Mill.

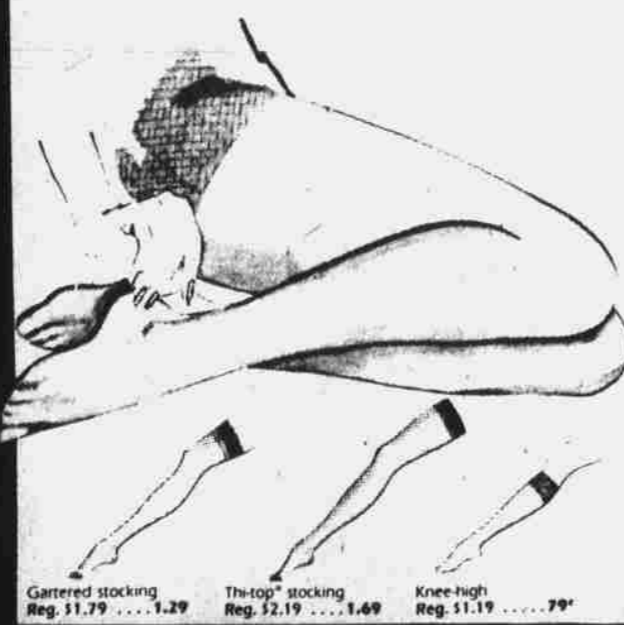
