NEW YORK — The campaign drive for the Christmas Tree in Harlem for 1981 rocketed from its pad at the New Smalls Paradise like space shuttle Columbia last Wednesday night at the Jimmy Booker Uptown Lowdown

NYC. Just about every black judge in the city was present. Former Manhattan Borough President Percy Sutton, incumbent Borough President Andrew Stein and hopeful Borough President David Dinkins all showed up, in ad-

dition to Congressman Charles Rangel and District Attorney Robert Morgenthau. Booker was hailed for his 30th anniversary as a top journalist.

Beverly Poppell, who hosts "Community Consumer Advocate" every Sunday morning on WBLS-FM New York received the national media award for radio from the American Women in Radio and Television for her series "A Woman's Dilemma: The Trouble With Tampons," at the AWRT National Convention in Washington.

Former U.S. Ambassador to Algeria Ulric Haynes has been named to the board of ABC. Haynes, a vice president of Cummins Engine Co. of Columbus, Indiana recently spoke before The Media Forum in Hollywood where he charged that blacks have been manipulated by the media into ignoring world affairs and resegregating themselves. He said the media and advertisers have led blacks to concentrate on the "cosmetics" of black heritage, not on its current international significance and called for black media figures to lead the race to a concern for world affairs. Haynes played a significant role in negotiating the release of the hostages from Iran.

The Top 10 for the 1980-81 TV season, as compiled by CBS shows "The Jeffersons" in No. 7 position. Last week's Nielson rating had the show in No. 5 position. And the spinoff from the series, "Checking In," starring Maria (Florence the maid) will be shown as a four-week summer replacement which, if it catches on, will go into the fall schedule.

In Philadelphia Malcolm Poindexter has been named host of KYW-TV's "Eyewitness Newsmakers." He's also business manager for the Opera Ebony Endowment Fund that is launching a national drive, headed by Marian Anderson, asking one million persons to donate \$1 each to keep this company existing. The Blue Note Social Club is presenting its 27th annual Togetherness Dance with a musician's reunion, guest artists and many stars at the Savoy Manor Ballroom, 120 E. 149th Street on Sunday, June 7. Former big band sax player Mike Hedley is the man behind this.

"Big Time Buck White," the play that Muhammad Ali once did on Broadway is being presented this week and May 21-22 by the Harlem Uhuru Repertory Company at the Harlem State Office building. Admission is free.

Marcia Pharr, an upcoming singing artist, will be presented Sunday, May 31, at 5 p.m. at Cami Hall, 165 W. 57th St. You can hear her now on PJP Records' "Cheer Up." Larry Norman will be guest artist with her at Cami Hall. Marcia's dad is pastor of Harlem's Greater Hood Memorial AME Zion Church.

Claudia McNeil, who appeared as Mama Lena Younger in the original stage "Raisin In The Sun" and in the movie and in the musical "Raisin" opened in the musical May 14 which will run through June 7 at the Equity Library Theater.

In Hollywood, a coalition of minority entertainment figures and 23 media and community organizations have filed a petition with the FCC asking it to reject NBC's bid for low-power TV station licenses. The coalition has also protested against ABC's applications for low-power licenses and CBS' plans to enter the cable-TV area. The group was formed last fall to improve the image of minorities in the media and to monitor the placing of minorities in important executive positions.

The Harlem Bicycle Race, backed by Budweiser Beer, will be held in Mount Morris Park on June 21. It's sponsored by the 32nd Precinct Community Council.

CBS-TV's football sport-caster Irv Cross will be honored on May 15 when the Council of Concerned Black Executives holds its Monte Carlo '81 at the New York Statler Hotel.

The 50th Anniversary of Brooklyn College will be celebrated on May 16 with the world premiere of Robert Starer's "Voices of Brooklyn" and Agustin Anieves performing Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue" with the Brooklyn College Symphonic Band and Chorus at Walt Whitman Hall.

Now on exhibit at the Studio Museum in Harlem are "Extensions: Non-Conventional Photographic Imagery" and "Gifts and Promised Gifts: the Permanent Collection featuring Recent Acquisitions", through June 21.
