"Ask the Expert" is a Call For Action special feature designed to respond to an identified need in a given area. It was started in 1976 when volunteers at CFA stations noted an increasing number of legal questions and asked lawyers to

answer CFA phones directly. It has since expanded to include other issues, and "Ask the Mail Order Expert" is CFA's third national Expert Day, joining "Ask the Lawyer Day" and "Ask the Tax Expert Day."
