

Political Party To Sponsor Community Day Saturday

the National Black In-

dependent Political Party (NBIPP) is sponsoring its first annual Community Day Picnic, Saturday, May 23, noon-6 p.m., at Hillside Park on South Roxboro Street.

Mrs. Teverious Williams. local coconvenor for NBIPP, said that Community Day is an event which she hopes will bring black families together. "One of the major goals of NBIPP is to build strong black institutions, and strengthening the black family is the first step," said Mrs. Williams.

Mrs. Williams said that on Community Day, information on many issues will be provided to the black community. One major issue to be stressed is hypertension and its drastic effects on black Americans, both young and old.

"Because high blooc pressure is twice as prevalent among black Americans as among white Americans, we will be offering free blood pressure checks to everyone by registered nurses," said Mrs. Williams, known to the Durham community as Sister Tee.

Other features of Community Day will include exhibits by local artists, available information in Durham on senior citizens, information on African Liberation Day, contests and games for children, a karate demonstration, and entertainment under the direction of Sherman Fogg by Burton School dancers.

The public is invited and those attending may bring their own picnic baskets or they may purchase hot foods, including deserts at a low cost.

(Continued from Front) fered his encouragement. Dr. Cleveland Hammonds, superintendent, Durham City Schools, called the group's task a great challenge and commended their courage.

Jim Polk, representing Durham County Schools, said the support of both school systems would greatly enhance the group's effectiveness. He called the group a community benefit saying they will help alleviate many within the problems schools.

State Senator Jerry Hancock was present also. In remarks to the audience, Mrs. Moore's concern was the significance and critical importance of the Institute, whose sole function is black ad-

"Blacks should be in child advocacy forefront; it is our children that are in the worst shape," she said, "while explaining the need

for black leadership. "It is imperative that we become involved in public policy in this country," Mrs. Moore said. She cited infant mortality and black poverty statistics as well as the lack of prenatal care among black mothers and the many black families that are headed by mothers as evidence.

She charged the group to "focus on issues that will make life better for a lot of children," and charged the black community to rally its full support behind the BCDI-D. "The black community must lead because our children are hurting the most,"said Mrs. Moore.

The NBCDI is an independent, non-profit organization that organizes through national affiliates. The affiliate structure has allowed the NBCDI to be successful in getting parents and communities to play a dominate role in determining programs and impacting upon policies that af-

fect their children. The local institute will address many issues of black child concern including day care, child welfare, education, health, and black child adoption.


