## NBIPP-Durham Holds Leadership Training Workshop

The National Black Independent Political Party-Durham held its first leadership training workshop on May 30, at Russell Memorial CME Church for the purpose of providing and/or strengthening community organizing skills, for developing Party positions on key issues, and for introducing members and friends to the process of developing food cooperatives.

The highlight of the workshop was a presentation by Makaza Kumanyika, executive director of Agricultural Farms, Inc., headquartered in Raleigh, on establishing farm-to-market marketing cooperatives. His presentation detailed the technical assistance, research, training, and informational services which the group provides on request to agriculturally impoverished communities throughout the United States, Africa, and the Caribbean Islands. He emphasized the urgency for black consumers to support the more than 6,000 black farmers in North Carolina, many of whom are threatened with non-existence. "The small black farmer has already lost his land and has been destroyed in most states. Black consumers in the state of North Carolina have the unique opportunity to save black farmers in this state by supporting them by buying their goods", said Kumanyika.

Dr. Dupree of Shaw will further address the need to establish food cooperatives in a presentation to be made at the next regular meeting of the Durham Chapter, Thursday, June 11 at 7:30. Union Baptist Church.

## Cool Apricot Desserts



Warm weather means parfait and sundae time. California apricots can make simple summertime desserts elegant. Apricots are the pick of the orchard!

**APRICOT SUNDAES**  
(Makes 4 servings)

½ lb. fresh California apricots, pitted, halved  
2 tablespoons orange-flavored liqueur  
1 tablespoon butter or margarine

½ cup chopped pecans  
1 pint vanilla ice cream

In medium bowl, combine apricots and liqueur; chill. Meanwhile, melt butter in small skillet. Add pecans and saute 1 to 2 minutes until browned. Cool.

To serve, scoop ice cream into dessert dishes. Spoon on apricot mixture; top with toasted pecans.

(Makes 4 servings)

½ lb. fresh California apricots, pitted, chopped

¼ cup sliced pitted dates  
2 containers (8 oz.) vanilla yogurt

¼ cup granola
