One of the provisions was "The Vial of Life" which was introduced to Granville County during the East of Granville Festival.

The "Vial of Life" is a medical information form on which the name, address, health problems, medications used, allergies, etc. of an individual are listed, placed in a vial and tied onto a refrigerator shelf. In case of an emergency, the vial is removed by police, fire and/or ambulance rescue personnel and taken along with the patient to the doctor or hospital.

Because many black people suffer with hypertension/high blood pressure and associated illnesses, current medical information in the vial could possibly help to save a life.
