Durning, Bridges, Kane and Auger Star in Shaw's Trilogy

Three short stories by internationally renowned author Irwin Shaw will be brought to public television in the forthcoming special "The Girls in Their Summer Dresses and Other Stories by Irwin Shaw" airing on Great



Performances on Monday, June 29 at 9 p.m. On Center Channel 4. Charles Durning, Jeff Bridges, Carol Kane, and Claudine Auger join other stars in the three separate productions which were shot on location in New York City, London and Paris. The three stories have as their common theme the emotional and philosophical differences which serve as a catalyst for (and the undoing of) the interpersonal relationships among diverse "couples."

The title story, "The Girls in Their Summer Dresses" stars Oscar nominees, Carol Kane and Jeff Bridges, Filmed on location in Greenwich Village, the contemporary story centers on a couple's marital relationship and their conflicting views of monogamy. It is adapted from Shaw's short story of the same name and it marks Bridges' first appearance in a television production.

"The Monument" is the second production which stars Charles Durning and features Brian Dennehy and Rick Lieberman. It also was taped in New York City and is set in the 1930's. The piece is a poignant study of the human quest to leave behind a memorial in honor of oneself — a "monument"

establishing one's immortali-

The third adaptation in the trilogy and the longest of the three, running 50 minutes, was shot in Paris and is adapted from Shaw's "The Man Who Married a French Wife." Claudine Auger, Bob Sherman and Pierre Santini star in this tale of lost innocence and re-kindled love. It is set in the 1960's.

Lindsay Law, Head of Drama for WNET, New York, and the producer of two of the telecast's three short stories, "The Girls in Their Summer Dresses" and "The Monument," looks at the unique co-production between his station and BBC-, TV as an important breakthrough for public television in America. "It's

the first time for us that one special has been co-produced by two broadcast entities," notes Law. "We produced our production segments and BBC-TV indepentently produced their show. All three were then nicely packaged as the Shaw trilogy. Two producers were assigned, as were two directors and two separate production crews. We trusted them and they trusted us. It was a wonderful experience and it worked."

Law's co-producer in this venture is Britain's Alan Shallcross, whose "The Man Who Married a French Wife," shot in Paris and London, makes the third production in the Shaw trilogy.
