This family reunion was planned by two members of the second generation, Allen Brown, Jr., of Durham, and Terrah Brown of Chadbourne, who along with others, served as the hosts.

Columbus County gave a beautiful and proper setting for this momentous occasion. Both the late Mr. and Mrs. Brown were born, married, reared their children, and played active, leading roles in the community affairs of Chadbourne and Cerro Gordo communities.

At the family's first gathern on Saturday afternoon, Rev. V.E. Brown, member of the first generation and pastor of Gethsemane Baptist Church of Durham, gave much of the family history. His brother, Dr. Eldee L. Brown, founder and director of the Clarahope Chiropractic Health Center, served as master of ceremonies.

The Saturday night family disco at Corbett's Recreation Center in Whiteville, saw family members, and their friends, from age 8 to 70, dancing and having much wholesome fun and enjoyment together.
