**Citywide
Survey
Going On**

A household needs survey aimed at obtaining up-to-date population and housing statistics for use by Durham city government is being carried out by summer interns of the Planning and Community Development Department.

Door-to-door interviews of five per cent of all resident households in the city started Wednesday, July 22, and will continue for three weeks.

Interview questions will deal with housing types, conditions, and costs, and with household composition, needs and economic conditions. All information will be confidentially tabulated in summary form immediately following the interviews.

The information collected by the survey will be used in identifying current housing needs of different neighborhoods and population groups, in estimating a variety of future housing needs, and in verifying local data recently collected by the U.S. Census Bureau. The survey is unique for the city, both in the range of questions being asked and in the coverage of a sample of all parts of the city at one time. The information collected in this survey is not expected to be gathered again by the city for another five to ten years.
