

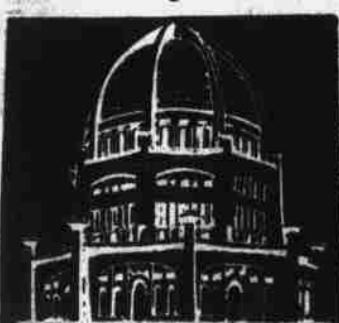
CHURCH NOTES
