Miss Jacqueline Burnette McNeill, 24, formerly of Fayetteville, was funeralized Sunday afternoon at New Bethel AME Zion Church.

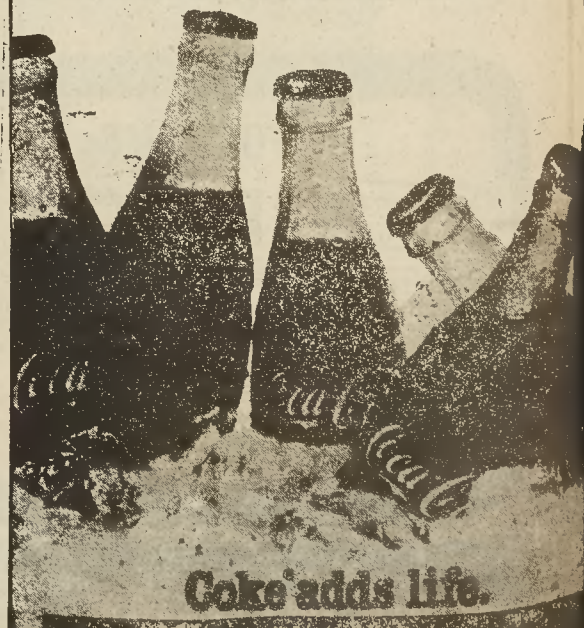
