Dr. Speigner is an ordained clergyman in The American Lutheran Church and holds the title "clergy emeritus" in The American Lutheran Church. "The three generation family was never common in America," Miss Buckley says. "The first settlers left their parents in the 'old country.' Later they moved west while the parents stayed east."

"But the basic reason the three generation family was never common is simply that people didn't live that long," the specialist says. "Life often did end at 40 and, at the turn of the century, ..."

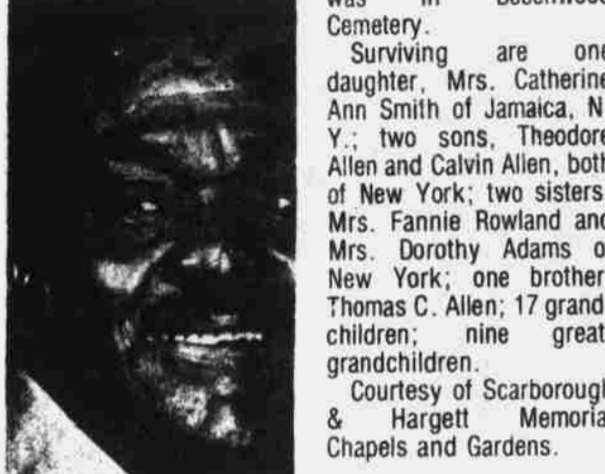

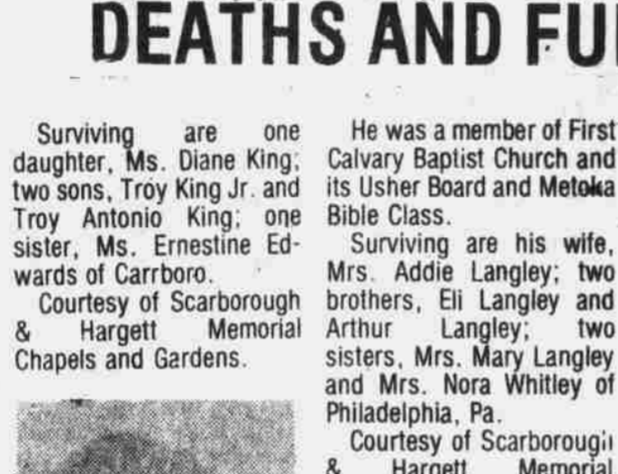
