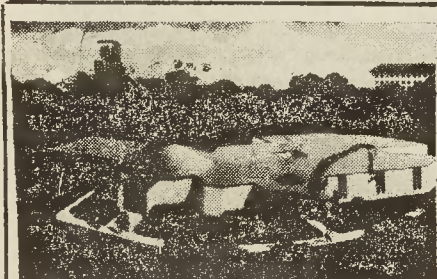

Festival-Choirs To Be Held At St. Joseph's Sunday

The Durham Section of the National Council of Negro Women will open the second half of its 1981 season with the second annual "Festival of Choirs" extravaganza at St. Joseph's AME Church, Mrs. Johnnie B. McLester, program chairman, announced Wednesday.

The special singing festival is the group's only fund raising project.

The program, to be held Sunday, September 27, at 4 p.m., features youth choirs from Durham and surrounding communities.

Mrs. McLester said youth involvement in programs sponsored by the NCNW represents the group's commitment to training today's youth to be tomorrow's leaders.

Hosting the singing occasion will be the St. Joseph's Inspirational Singers. A tentative list of other choirs includes the White Rock Baptist Church Youth Choir, the New Covenant Holiness Church Youth Choir, the West Durham Baptist Church Children's Choir, the Little Zion Holiness Church Young Adult Choir of Henderson, and the Lincoln Memorial Baptist Church Senior Choir. Students forming the vocal and string ensemble will also perform.

The local chapter encourages community involvement in its projects — men and women. The Durham Section will have the first Sunday of the month at White Rock Baptist Church at 3 p.m. Proceeds from the event will help the group continue its tradition of advocacy and service. Projects of the chapter include a pledge to the Life Community. The Center Fund, the presentation of the Thelma Denson Achievement Award and Certificates of Appreciation to youths in the Durham City School System sending books to children in developing countries.

Since its founding in 1935 by Mary McLester, the National Council of Negro Women has been a major force in the quest for equality and has helped people to help themselves. The NCNW has been effective in combatting hunger, malnutrition, training women for community leadership, providing services for children and youth, working with women in developing countries and strengthening family life.

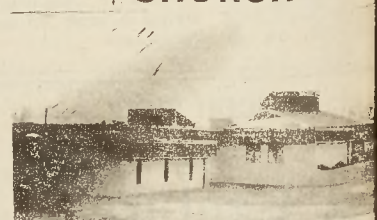
