Junior fullback Benny Tate, who was moved to tailback in the fourth quarter, rambled for 76 yards on just 11 carries. He got 41 of those yards on Central's next posses sion, as the Eagles went 60 yards for the score. Fraylon went over from the one with 4:54 left, giving the Eagles a 14-0 lead.

Defensive tackle John Hunt scored the final touchdown. He picked off a screen pass and rac-ed 52 yards to paydirt at 2:24. The Rams saw Chris McKinstry have two sacks pushing Winston-Salem back from the NCCU 17 to the 39 setting up Hunt' heroics.

McKinstry wound up with five solo tackles and eight assists, and was in on five quarterback sacks. Curtis Woods, a junior linebacker, had four solos and 10 assists.


